500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation 2017

2017 marks the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. On October 31st 1517 Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses against indulgences to the door of the castle church in Wittenberg, setting in train a series of events that led to the splintering of Western Christendom. The impact of Luther's Reformation extended throughout Europe and beyond, and its consequences can still be felt clearly today.
